2. LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

Programs:

Most summer programs ended last month and they were all well attended. During July two different escape rooms are being offered at various times. The String Beans concert last Thursday night had an estimated 265 present despite the high heat. Attendance numbers for all summer events will be reported at a later meeting.

This month's book group activities include Reader's Choice discussing <u>Manhattan Beach</u> by Jennifer Egan on July 11, Midday Mysteries reading <u>A Dangerous Goodbye</u> by Fliss Chester for July 19, and Random Reads talking about <u>The Forgotten Home Child</u> by Genevieve Graham on July 25. R&R continues to discuss current books read and will meet on July 14.

Operations

S(h)elf Improvement Project: The shelf end panels and tops for the new shelving units arrived and were installed, but the wrong stain was used (discovered after we complained) so they have been removed again and hopefully will arrive, with the correct stain, soon. The iPads have been installed and signage will be made regarding their use.

Staff: Staff received approval to replace the soon to be vacant Library Clerk position with a Library Assistant I. We are advertising for this now.

July 4: Friends of Seward Library made over \$1,300 on the 4th and the books will remain available until 3:00 p.m. today when they will be moved to the Book Nook, used book table, or storage. Some will be set aside to be recycled.

Storm Damage: The June 14 hail storm damaged most of the library's windows, dented metal gutters, downspouts, and the pergola roof, and staff is sure damaged the roof. One of the upper tower windows had both panes broken so damage was done to the interior of that room with small and large glass pieces everywhere. Staff has closed off that room until insurance determines if we can have it professionally cleaned and carpet replaced, or what other action is needed. We have to date not heard back from insurance.
